Metaphor

Comparing two things **NOT** using "like" or "as"

When life hands you lemons, make lemonade.

Hyperbole

An outrageous exaggeration that emphasizes a point

There were a ton of lemons in that cup of lemonade.

Onomatopoeia

Names an action by a sound.

plump, crash, thud, thump

Personification

Gives human characteristics (actions, feelings, thoughts) to nonhuman objects, animals, and ideas.

The lemonade danced in a her mouth.



Idiom

A commonly used expression of a group or culture.

I'm feeling under the weather.




