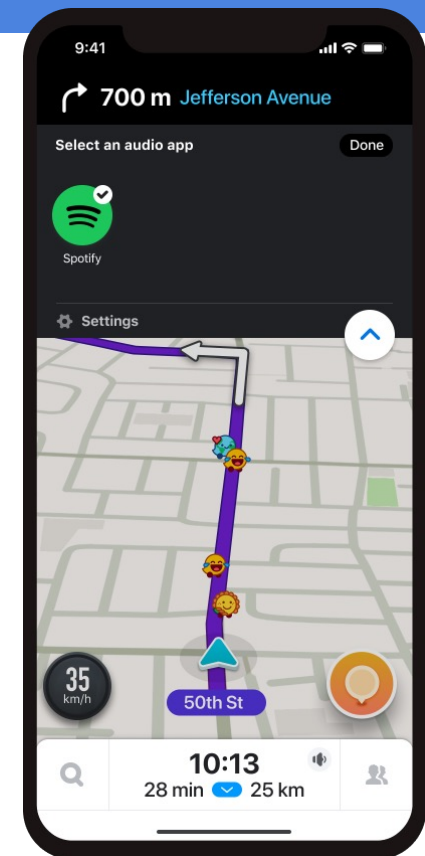
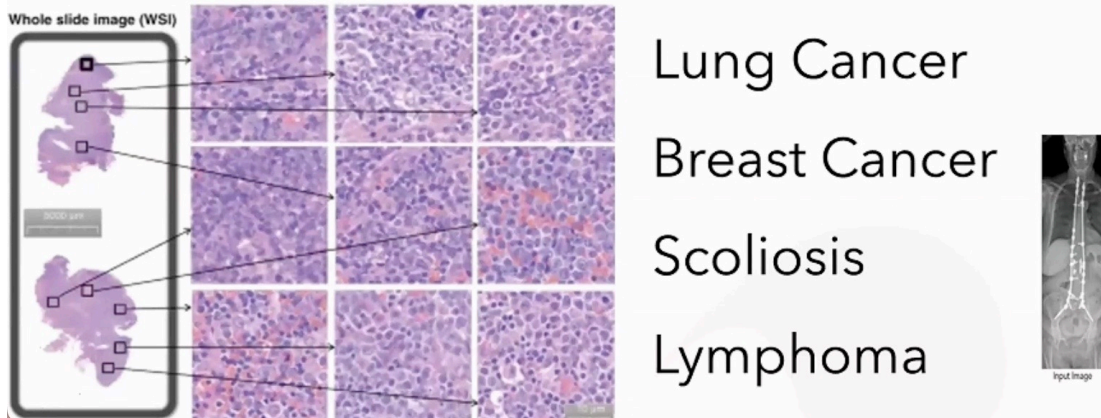

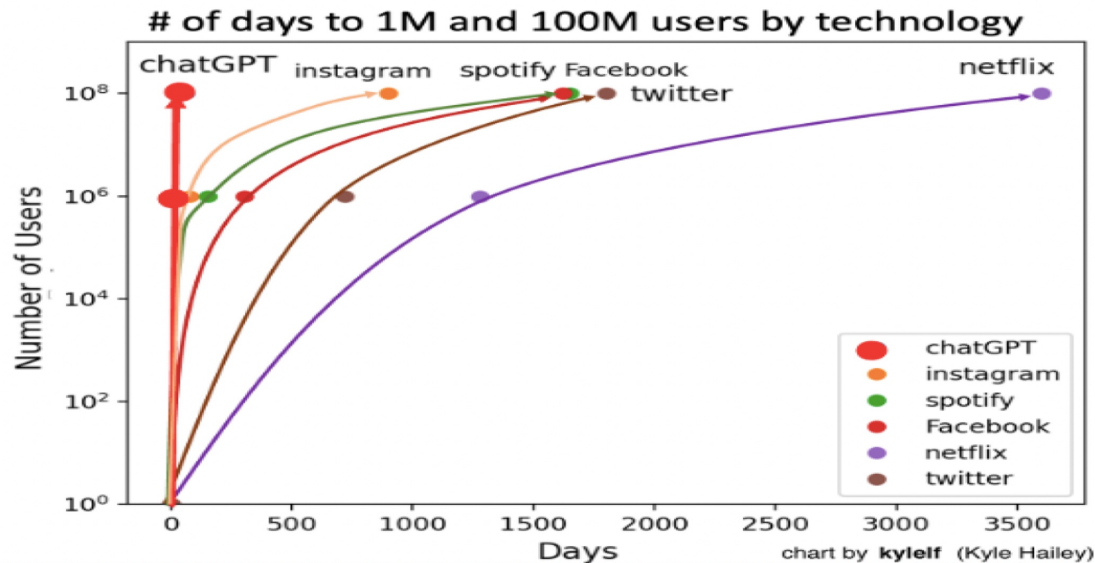

If under 18, either get express permission from parents. Send an opt out to parents

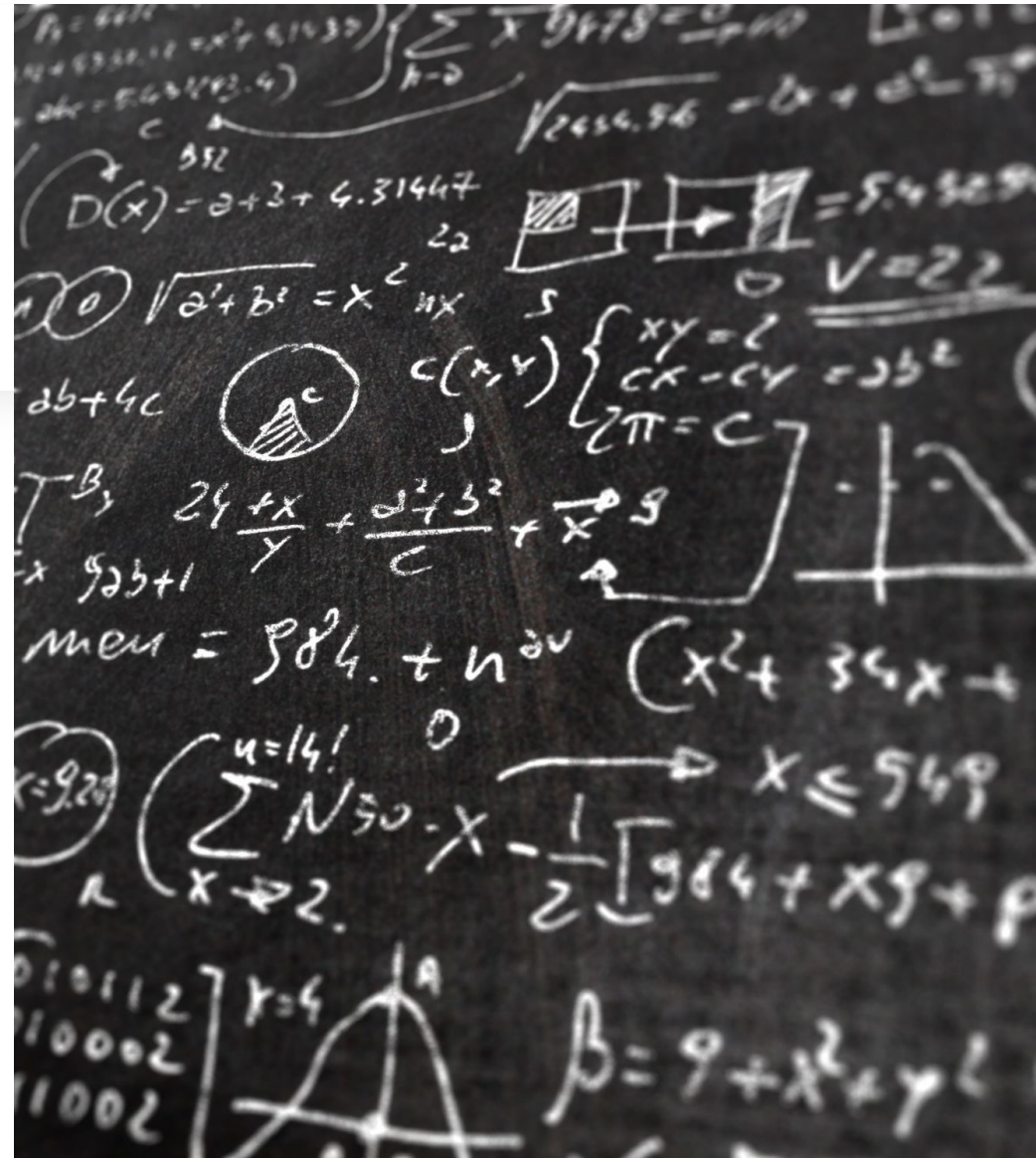
### Best practices

- For students, don't use PII
- Turn off the use data for training
- If using for grading, omit student details, create your own code to identify student.
- If worried use local models (Msty & Ollama)

ChatGPT should not be used to generate output that would be considered non-public.

# Privacy and IP Concerns

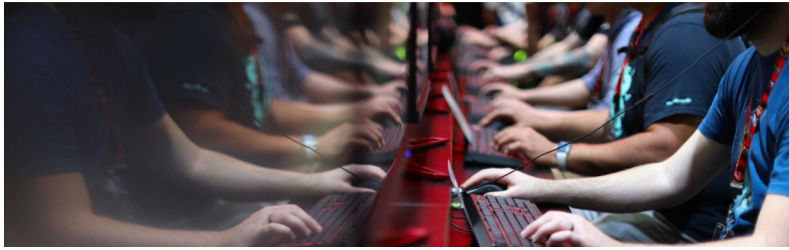
- “Turnitin’s self-reported 4% false positive rate (after initially reporting 1%)
- Turnitin was only trained on GPT and not other LLMs
  - It is unclear how student work was being used to further train Turnitin’s AI detection tool
  - Loss of student trust
  - Bad publicity and
  - Legal sanctions”

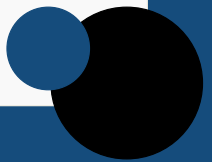

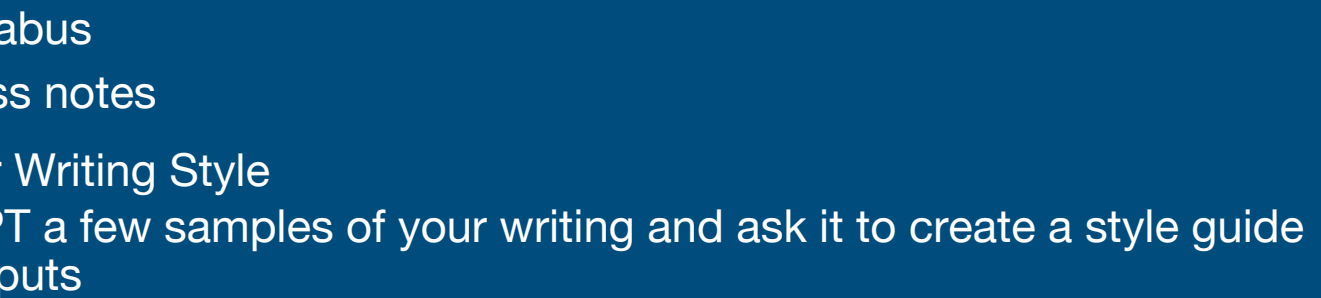

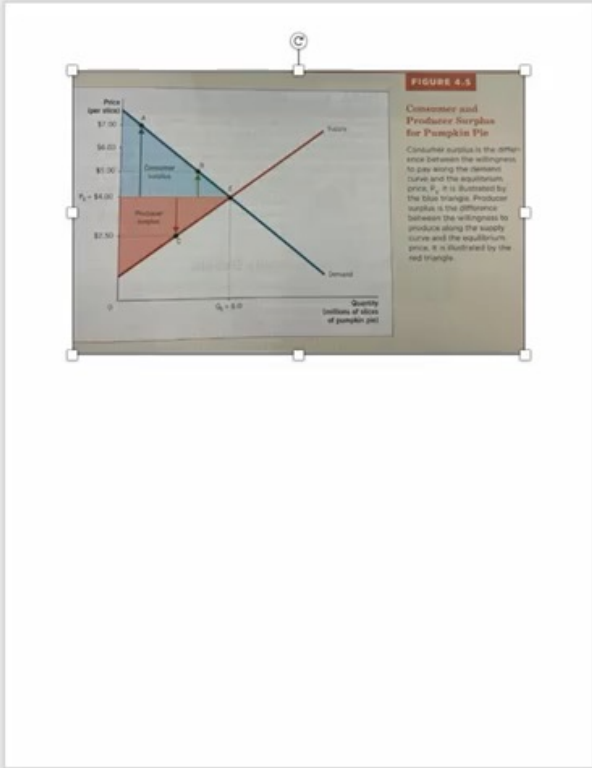

- Group (Even numbers): Using the textbook/readings, find the 3 errors introduced in the essay and correct it. Cite your sources.

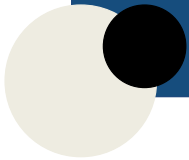


# Classroom activities

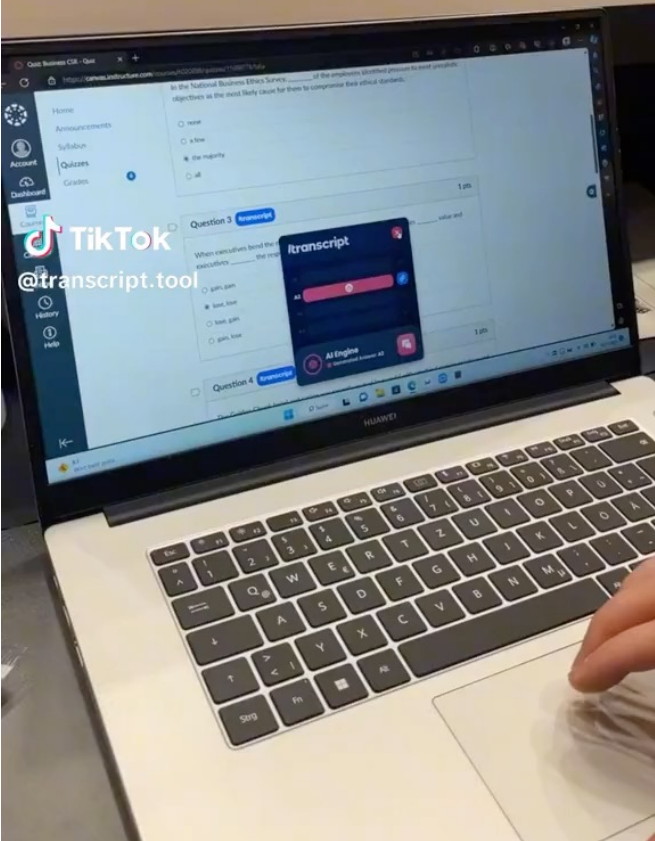

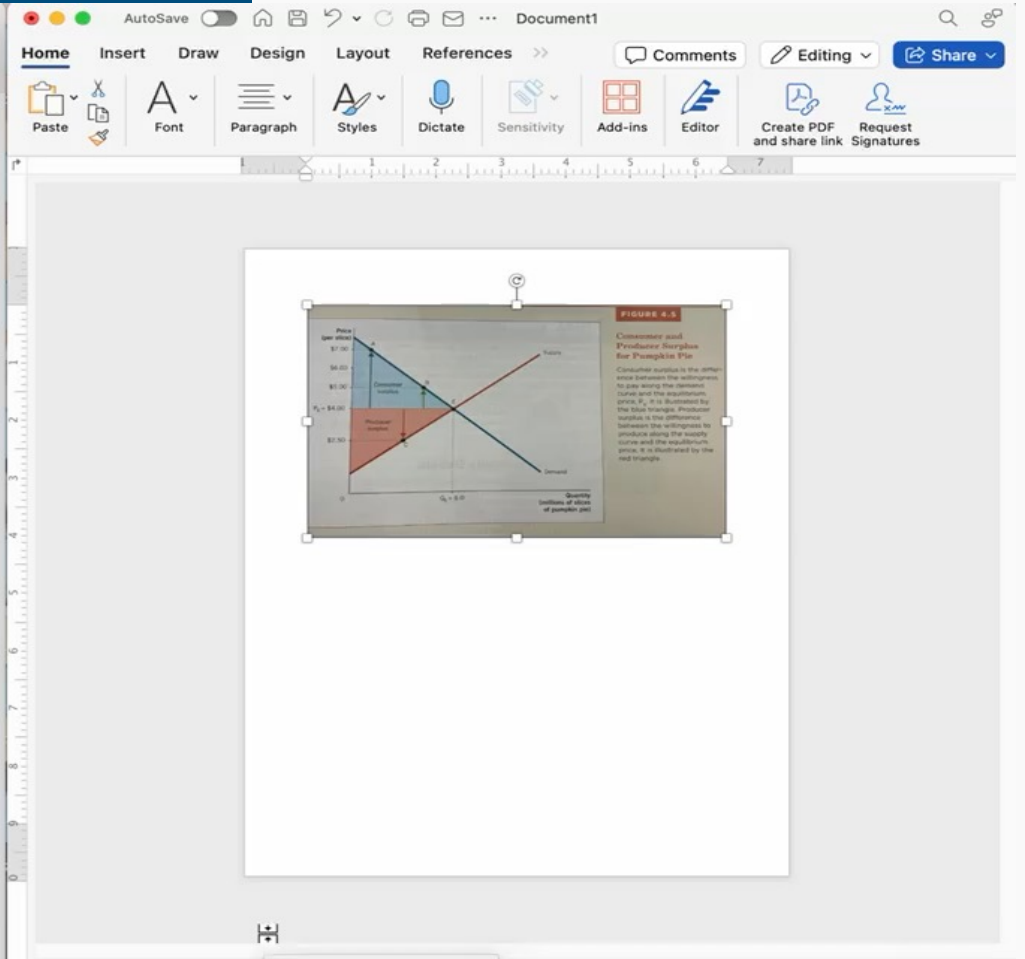

- Feed your assignments to AI to see if they can be done by AI, if so, change them.
- Don't bother with preventive tools (eg chatgpt zero).
- Assume that ALL students will use AI
- Motivate the value of learning
